

D. ACTIVITIES

1 June 2017 - The pan-democratic Legislative Council members and I met with Mr Matthew Cheung Kin-chung, the Chief Secretary for Administration on the Finance Committee's agenda and order of items to be discussed.

12 June 2017 - I conducted a site inspection with landscape architecture students of the ecological environment of buffalos and brown cattles in Hong Kong to learn about their habitat. It helps to explore local "Satoyama Initiatives" for safeguarding the socio-ecological production landscapes.






16 June 2017 - The Pro-democracy camp members held a joint press conference, in response to Kai Tak Sports Park jumping the queue in the Finance Committee of the LegCo, in which the project itself has a lot of controversy.

17 June 2017- EYO, Land Education Foundation, HK Organic Association and GROW co-organized "Conference on Hong Kong Agricultural Development 2017" with the theme of developing local "Satoyama Initiatives" to safeguard socio-ecological production landscapes. The views of the forum will be used to move forward the agricultural and conservation policies in the future.





19 June 2017 - I attended a press conference held by the Central & Western Concern Group and Sai Wan Concern Group requesting TPB to reject the development scheme plan of Staunton Street and Wing Lee Street (H19 Project). It succeeded to shelve the scheme.
